Supervisor's Message



"May you live in interesting times!" Purportedly a Chinese curse (but that's not the true origin), this phrase certainly characterizes our world. However, I'm going to flip this a bit and suggest that "interesting" can be

interpreted literally or figuratively, positively or negatively.

On the positive and literal side, please come to the Town Hall on Saturday, September 29th between 11 am and 2 pm to participate in our third annual Township Day, celebrating "Townships: Past and Future". Lund Hall will be filled with people who can provide you with information about a wide range of services and programs, including the Township's, the food pantries, Rock Island Library, Parks and Recreation Department, King Center, NAACP, Spring Forward Learning Center, Rocky Resource Room and more!

The Hanson Family Jugglers and Unicyclists will astonish us with their skills; the Police Department's K-9 will demonstrate what they can do to keep us safe; the Fire Department's ambulance and pumper truck will be present so you can see the equipment that fights fires and is used to treat medical emergencies; the Metro Youth Program's Drill Team will (literally) kick things off; the A.C.T.I.V.E. Club will make and serve walking tacos; Kendall Davis, Master Design Boomerangs, will amaze us with the art of throwing a stick that ultimately goes nowhere; there will be face

painting for the kids and popcorn too! (see the article on page 4 for more details.)

On the other side of the coin, we've been living through an "interesting" political period. While there are emotions and divisiveness associated with local, state and national politics, we live in a participatory and representative democracy. Our representatives are periodically chosen by voters to analyze issues and make policy, pass laws affecting our safety and approve budgets. 

Assessor's Office

In the 2019 (payable 2020) tax year all assessors are required to revalue every property within their jurisdiction. This is called a quadrennial year or a general assessment year.

This means we will be out roaming your neighborhoods more than usual. We wear picture ID badges and we have signs on our cars that identify us as the Rock Island Township Assessment Office. We will be taking pictures of your house for our records (both front and back) and making notes on our clip boards. If you have any doubts about our identity, ask to see our ID and if you still have doubts don't hesitate to call our office at 309/786-2961 and ask what area we are working in that day.

CHANGE OF ASSESSMENT NOTICES

Sometime in the middle of September (no exact date is available yet) the county will be sending out Change of Assessment Notices for the 2018 tax year and publishing the changes in the newspaper.

You will receive a notice if your assessment was increased or decreased for any reason except the factor.

You will receive a notice if changes were made to both the land value and building value, but the total assessment remained the same.

If you disagree with your assessment, you will have 30 days from the date of publication to file an appeal with the Board of Review.

You can pick up appeal papers at the Supervisor of Assessments office, 1504 3rd Ave, Rock Island or my office at 2827 7th Ave Rock Island.

At our office, you can request

copies of Property Record Cards for properties you feel are comparable to yours. You can request a list of sales that took place in your neighborhood during the past three years to assist you in your appeal.

But PLEASE come and see us first. Let us know why you think your assessment is incorrect and then if we still disagree, we will provide you with the forms needed to appeal.

EXTENDED OFFICE HOURS

Our normal office hours are Monday thru Friday from 8 AM to Noon and 1 PM to 4 PM. We realize that not all residents are able to get to our office during these hours. So, beginning September 18th thru October 13th our office will remain open until 6 PM on Tuesdays and Thursdays and will be open on Saturday mornings from 9 AM to Noon. If you want to discuss your assessment, find out how to appeal or sign up for exemptions just stop in. You don't need an appointment.

TOWNSHIP DAY CELEBRATION

September 29th is our annual Township Day. Last year we commemorated our past by naming our park Matthew Parker Jr. Memorial Gardens. This year, we place emphasis on the children who are our community leaders of the future. The hours are 11 am to 2 pm. All kinds of social service agencies will be here to meet you and hand out information. We'll have free food and lots of entertainment. If you've never seen the World Record Setting Hanson Family Jugglers and Unicyclists you don't want to miss this. Also

Kendall Davis, the Master Design Boomerang Man will be on hand to show you how to throw a boomerang so that it comes back to you. Metro Youth Drill Team will be here to perform. The Rock Island Canine officer will be here to take a bite out of crime. You can get your face painted, climb on the fire truck, enjoy some popcorn and eat some Walking Tacos prepared for us by the Martin Luther King Center's A.C.T.I.V.E. Club.

Hi everyone! Summer is almost over and my favorite season is just around the corner – Fall! Cooler weather, leaves turning color, windows open – air conditioner off and best of all being outside to enjoy it all! Taking lots of pictures and watching people getting ready for the snow!

The Park's Department summer programs for youth are on the list of projects supported by the Township.

I take walks during the summer at Rock Island's Parks. My two favorites include Lincoln and Longview. That being said; I watched many Rock Island Township youngsters at play! The Park's Department staff had planned something for all the children. From playing baseball with sticks to hopscotch or just playing on the swings - the children were busy interacting with one another and having a great deal of fun. Their play was organized because there were so many of them; but I doubt that any of them knew it! I took a few pictures of kids just being kids!

Rock Island Township marks the beginning of Fall with a celebration that you are all invited: on September 29th Rock Island Township invites you to "Township Day", 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The Day is held in and on the Township grounds at 2827 7th Avenue in Rock Island. Our focus last year was our past with the dedication of Matthew Parker Garden. This year we celebrate our future with lots of fun things – township youth! Have a cold drink, take a walk through the Town Hall and witness all that we are doing: booths, showing all we support for residents living in our Township: youth and senior programs, housing programs, gardening & food distribution programs and many more. Grab a taco in a bag and a cold drink and enjoy our feature events, the Hanson Family jugglers followed by, Kendall Davis' boomerang entertainment, a visit from the Police Department's K-9, a tour of the City's ambulance and fire truck! Township Day is three hours of FREE family fun and some real insight into what your Township is doing for You! You won't be sorry you stopped by.

As the Rock Island Township Clerk, part of my responsibility is to keep the minutes of our monthly meetings. There are two mandatory programs that many/most of our residents do not hear much about so they really don't understand what they do. The first is:

General Assistance: Each month the board hears a report from the Supervisor about our General Assistance Program. Due to

confidentially laws that protect our clients, it is impossible for Supervisor Alan Carmen to give the names of the clients the township helps, or the stories that made it necessary for our residents to apply for monthly assistance. So, each month the number of clients served is reported along with the amounts paid out for rent, utilities, personal needs and food. Last fiscal year the township helped an average of 45 clients per month with a grant of up to \$300.00 that takes care of the client's basic needs. What isn't said often enough is; township assistance can only be granted to residents of the township. To receive assistance, one must not be eligible for any other form of assistance and the client must search for work or be current with medical and legal appointments until SSI is granted. That being said, most of our clients, are truly indigent and single. If it were not for township help they would have to live on the street. It is the most important work we do. A booth providing information about General Assistance will be available at Township Day. If you know of a resident, or are in a position yourself of needing help or you just want to know more about how the program works - someone will be available to answer your questions.

Assessment of Property: Our Township Assessor, Brenda Carmen, holds a wealth of information about the 6,591 parcels of property in our township. The role of the Assessor is to assess (put a value) on all property in the township. It is a complicated process that most people hardly notice is happening. The Assessor has a complete record of your property; if you would like to know how the value was set, she will be more than happy to explain it to you. Assessor Carmen knows all the state exemptions and will be more than willing to let you know if you qualify. We are all a bit uncomfortable when we want to ask questions about something we don't understand. Assessor Carmen is very understanding and will take the time to help you get the answers that will help you better understand the process! Stop in the Assessor's Office; she and her staff look forward to talking with each of you.

I've used this space to focus on Township Day because I join with our Board in wanting you to participate, understand and become a supporter of township government. We will all be available to welcome you and hopefully get to know you.

2018 Senior Holiday Luncheon

Our 17th Annual Senior Holiday Luncheon is set for Wednesday, December 12, 2018. A wonderful holiday dinner and all the trimmings will be served, along with a special visit from the Claus Family and other entertainment. Gift cards and poinsettias will also be given away. If you are 65 or older and live in Rock Island Township, call 309/788-3417 to make a reservation.



EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

If you had an emergency that prevented you from paying your rent or mortgage or your utility bills (MidAmerican gas / electricity or City of Rock Island water / sewer), the Township may be able to assist. If you qualify, the Township could pay a maximum of either \$400 or \$450 towards those costs. You must have an income and show that you can pay future living expenses. Applications are accepted year-round and are available during our regular business hours.

We assisted 120 clients last fiscal year (April 2017 – March 2018), with 51 families or individuals receiving assistance since April 2018.

If you qualify for our General Assistance Program, you are not eligible for the Emergency Assistance Program.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

If you have applied for disability benefits but have not been approved, or are an unemployed single individual looking for work who needs temporary help, the Township's General Assistance may be for you. If you qualify, we can pay up to \$200 for rent, provide a \$10 food voucher (in addition to your food stamps) and a \$57 Kmart voucher for personal needs. **Contact the office during business hours (8 a.m. – Noon; 1 – 4 p.m.) to get more information.**

TOWNSHIP GRANTS

We have limited funding to support agencies and organizations providing services and programs that benefit youth, seniors and veterans. Past grants were awarded to local food pantries, the King Center's A.C.T.I.V.E. Club, Spring Forward Learning Center, Community Gardens, Rocktown 340 Basketball Club, among others. **If you are interested in receiving a grant application, contact the Township at 309-788-3417 or go to our website where you can download it.**

FLU SHOTS

Rock Island Township will be the site for the Rock Island County Health Department to administer flu shots to qualified residents. They should be available in October 2018. There are approximately 75 immunization clinics throughout Rock Island County. The Health Department accepts reimbursement from Medicare, Medicaid, most Blue Cross Blue Shield plans, along with many other providers. Please check with the County for specific billing information and the complete schedule (309/793-1555). Watch for announcements on the Township's website and message board sign for the specific date and time.

EMERGENCY BLANKETS

We don't know exactly when they will arrive this year, but the Federal emergency blankets will be available at the Town Hall, probably in November. Composed of wool scraps and glue, these blankets cannot be washed, but they will keep you warm. We'll issue a news release when you can get them, or call 309/788-3417 to see if we have them.

SENIOR CARE VOUCHERS

If you are 65 or older and earn \$1,012 per month (or \$1,372 for a couple) or less, you might qualify for our monthly \$35.00 Save-a-Lot II Senior Cares food voucher program.

Call us at 309-788-3417 and an application will be sent to you. Once you have the required paperwork, call for an appointment where we'll review the details and see if you qualify.

TRY-Play PROGRAM


The Township Recreation Youth Play program provides scholarships to Park and Recreation programs and facilities. These include RIFAC, camps, inter-session programs, among others.
